

RESOLUTION NO. BHO 17-03

A RESOLUTION EXTENDING SOCIAL SECURITY COVERAGE TO ELIGIBLE EMPLOYEES OF THE THURSTON-MASON BEHAVIORAL HEALTH ORGANIZATION

WHEREAS, Thurston-Mason Behavioral Health Organization (TMBHO) desires to offer Social Security coverage to its employees,

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Thurston-Mason Behavioral Health Organization does hereby adopt the following resolution:

SECTION 1. It is hereby declared to be the policy and purpose of the Thurston-Mason Behavioral Health Organization Governing Board to extend the provisions of RCW 41.48.030, providing Social Security coverage to eligible employees of the Thurston-Mason Behavioral Health Organization.

SECTION 2. The Thurston-Mason BHO Administrator is authorized and directed to execute an agreement with the State of Washington to secure Social Security coverage of eligible employees as provided in Section 1.

SECTION 3. The coverage of eligible employees shall be effective as of August 1, 2017. *July 31 BB*

SECTION 4. Withholdings from salaries or wages of employees for the purposes provided in Section 1 of this Resolution are hereby authorized to be made in the amounts and at such times as may be required by applicable State and Federal laws and regulations, and shall be paid to the Internal Revenue Service, in such amounts and at such times as are designated in IRS Code 3121(b)(7)(E) and 3126.

SECTION 5. Employer contributions shall be paid from amounts appropriated for such purposes to the Internal Revenue Service in accordance with applicable Federal laws.

SECTION 7. The Thurston-Mason Behavioral Health Organization shall maintain such records and submit such reports as may be required by applicable State and Federal laws or regulations.


SECTION 8. This resolution shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage.
